NERKOOTAM AND SRADDHA COMMITTEE FORMATION

As per the directions of the Kerala Excise Commissioner’s Office (I/232394/2022), measures were initiated to prevent drug use among college students and to strengthen anti-narcotic activities on campus. Accordingly, under the Anti-Narcotics Club, a committee titled “**Nerkootam**” was constituted in the college under the leadership of Vice Principal Fr. Dinoy Kavalammakal. In addition, a hostel-level committee named “**Sraddha**” was formed under the leadership of the College Principal, Dr. Sunil C. Mathew, to ensure focused monitoring and awareness within the hostel community.

DRUG FREE KERALA

In accordance with the circular dated 27.09.2022 (K3/181/2022/HEDN) issued by the Department of Higher Education, the Anti-Narcotics Club of the College, under the leadership of Principal Dr. Sunil C. Mathew, organized activities as part of the state wide “Laharimukta Keralam” campaign to curb drug use and trafficking. A joint meeting of NSS and NCC was convened on 27.09.2022 at 1.00 PM to plan coordinated anti-drug initiatives. Subsequently, a consultative meeting was held on 28.09.2022 at 2.15 PM under the chairmanship of Kuravilangad Grama Panchayat President Mrs. Mini Mathai, with the participation of the Principal, College Bursar, Excise Officers, Ward Members, PTA and Alumni representatives, faculty members, Anti-Narcotics Club officials, NSS and NCC officers, and student representatives. It was resolved to intensify anti-drug activities from October 2 to November 1.





ANTI-DRUG CAMPAIGN MEETING

A joint meeting of the Anti-Narcotics Club, NSS, and NCC was held on 29.09.2022 at 11.30 AM under the leadership of Kaduthuruthy MLA Adv. Mons Joseph and Principal Dr. Sunil C. Mathew. Mr. Domi John, District Mass Media Officer from the Health Department, also participated. The Principal emphasized the need for immediate action to curb establishments that contribute to drug abuse among children. The meeting reviewed the anti-drug campaign planned from October 2 to November 1 and finalized measures for its effective implementation.

Laharimukta Campus Initiative

At the beginning of the academic year 2023–24, the college strengthened its anti-drug efforts under the “**Laharimukta Campus**” initiative, launching a comprehensive campaign to prevent drug abuse and promote a healthy, drug-free environment on campus. As part of this initiative, the *Pradeshika Janajagrata Samiti* was formed as an action committee to create awareness about the dangers of drug use and to encourage a positive and healthy lifestyle among students.




Based on the deliberations, a Master Plan was prepared to strengthen anti-drug initiatives on campus.

presentation on the dangers of substance abuse and the serious social and legal consequences associated with drug misuse.


