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PROFILE OF THE COLLEGE

Deva Matha College, Kuravilangad, was established on 3rd April 1964 under the inspiration of the Catholic Diocese of Palai managed by Major Archbishop Marth Mariam Archdeacon Pilgrim Church, Kuravilangad. True to the Christian values, the College stands for ensuring equity access to academic excellence, facilitating opportunities for the poor and the marginalized to better equip them to come to the mainstream. Deva Matha College, Kuravilangad is affiliated to Mahatma Gandhi University, Kottayam. It is recognized under section 2(f) and 12 B of the UGC Act 1956. The great visionaries, H. E. Mar Sebastian Vayalil, the then Bishop of the Diocese of Palai and Rev. Fr. Paul Alappattu, the then Vicar of St. Mary's Forane Church, Kuravilangad, who spearheaded the founding of the College, had in their minds the glorious task of dispelling darkness and spreading the light of true wisdom all around, irrespective of caste, creed, language or religion through the dissemination of knowledge and other skills that would mould the young generation into exemplary citizens well equipped to face the challenges of the times. True to its vision and mission, the College today has emerged as a knowledge hub and a leading centre of academic excellence, educating and transforming thousands of students who hail from a purely Agrarian-Rural background.

Situated in a rural milieu, in the heart of a minority community, the College aims at academic excellence in all spheres of learning, providing intellectual, moral, social, cultural and spiritual guidance to the young generation with a view to making them God-fearing, patriotic, altruistic and self-confident in life. Located beside the Major Archbishop Marth Mariam Archdeacon Pilgrim Church at Kuravilangad, in Kottayam District on a lush green eco-friendly campus of 12.5 acres/ 56585sq.mts, the College houses 8 Post Graduate Programmes, 11 Graduate Programmes and two Doctoral Programmes in Malayalam and English. The College is currently guided by the able leadership of H. E. Bishop Mar Joseph Kallarangatt as its Patron, Archpriest Very Rev. Dr. Thomas Menachery as its Manager and Dr. Sunil C. Mathew as its Principal.

Driven by its motto "Truth will make you free", the mission of Deva Matha College is to educate young men and women within a framework of liberal and moral values, to equip them to excel in the service of the nation and to attain optimum personal fulfilment by leading a value based life. The institution activates and achieves its vision and mission through well planned, innovatively executed curricular, co-curricular, extra-curricular activities as well as extension and outreach programmes. The Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC), along with the College Council and PTA, regularly evaluate the activities

of the College; formulate and implement strategies to achieve the goals and objectives of the institution. The unconditional support and cooperation of the entire stakeholders has been imperative in enabling the institution to strive for functional excellence.

Aiming at the empowerment and holistic development of the student community, the College offers many enrichment programmes like life orientation classes, career guidance, value education classes, computer literacy programmes such as Diploma in Computer Application, personality development classes, soft skills training, yoga training, training programme for quiz competitions, Walk with Scholar Programme, Scholar Support Programme, Coaching classes for competitive examination like NET/JRF / IBPS Examinations etc, foreign language classes, remedial and bridge courses. The College has distinguished itself in research and consultancy activities. Out of the 51 permanent teachers 29 hold Ph.D and 23 hold M.Phil. degrees and many are pursuing research Ph.D part time. In addition, 4 Ph.D holders and 4 M.Phil holders are serving in the self-financing UG & PG Departments.

The infrastructural facilities of the College play a vital role in the achievement of Institutional objectives. The buildings and other infrastructural facilities are well-maintained and used optimally. The College has a very spacious auditorium, rich library, air conditioned E-Learning Centre, ICT enabled class rooms, seminar halls, conference hall, air-conditioned multi-media hall, well equipped labs, IQAC office, VIP Lounge, yoga and health club, canteen, reprographic centre, Co-operative store, computer centers, counselling facility, hostels, indoor and outdoor game facilities and chapel for the use and benefit of students. College has an empathetic approach of support towards differently abled students. Staff guides and designated mentors offer mentoring to students personally. The College is giving more emphasis on encouraging peer teaching, cross teaching, introducing field work and internships, institutionalizing faculty appraisal, experimenting modern teaching methods, and so on.

Finishing school programmes and skill and job oriented training sessions are conducted to enhance employability skills of the students. Periodical evaluation on completion of the syllabus will be done by the Principal. Assignments/seminars should be allotted within 15 days after the commencement of each semester and evaluation of the same should be done before the end of first in-semester examinations.

RULES FOR GENERAL DISCIPLINE

1. Students of Deva Matha College Kuravilangad are expected to reach the college sufficiently early for the classes. On reaching the college they should go to the classrooms or library and engage themselves in some academic work. They should not wander about the college or talk in loud voice to disturb others.
2. Classes will be held from 9:30 a.m. to 12:30 p.m. and 1:15 p.m. to 3:15 p.m. for aided programs, and from 8:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. for self-financing programs. The time from 3:15 p.m. to 4:30 p.m. will be designated as tutorial hours.
3. Students are expected to behave in an exemplary manner within the college and outside.
4. Every day, classes begin with a prayer song. Students are requested to come to attention when the song begins and keep standing so till it ends. Students are expected to reach the class rooms before the prayer song commences. Students outside the class rooms too are expected to join the prayer song.
5. Students are expected to stand up when the teacher enters the classroom and remain standing till the teacher takes his/her seat or till they are allowed to sit down by the teacher.
6. Greet the teacher appropriately when he/she comes to the class. Say “Good Morning” or “Good After-noon” depending on whether it is fore-noon or after-noon. Say “Thank you, sir/madam” when the teacher leaves the class room. Greet teachers appropriately when you meet him/her outside the class room also.
7. No student shall enter or leave the class room when the session is on without the permission of the teacher.
8. Howling or shouting is not allowed within the college campus.
9. Students are expected to spend their free hours in the library or in the reading-room. They should not loiter along the corridor or crowd along the verandah.
10. Do not disfigure the walls, doors, windows, desks, tables and other items of furniture with graffiti, engravings etc.
11. Unauthorized crowding or assembly or procession inside the campus is strictly prohibited.
12. Politically based students’ organisations or outfits are not allowed within the campus. Students are strictly prohibited from organising, attending or participating in any political activity within the campus.

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13. The College being a temple of learning and a zone of knowledge, no student shall resort to any form of strike/ agitation / gherao or shouting slogans within the campus.
14. The Principal have the power to declare holiday for the college in case of emergencies.
15. In the matter of discipline, the decision of the Principal shall be final.
16. Students shall wear their ID tag within the campus, failing which a fine of Rs. 50/- will be imposed.
17. All students shall dress modestly and properly. Students are required to come in uniform except on Wednesday. Students not in proper dress-code/uniform will not be allowed to enter into the college campus.
18. Students are not supposed to wear T-shirts with indecent printing/writing on them and those without collar also.
19. Students are not allowed to enter other class rooms without prior permission of authorities.
20. Students absenting themselves from the class without proper leave application for more than 10 days shall be removed from the rolls. Re-admission of such students is the discretion of the Principal.
21. No student is allowed to remain in the campus after 4.30 p.m. without the permission of the Principal.
22. Students are not allowed to bring their vehicles beyond the parking area near the college gate as per the order of the Honourable High Court of Kerala.
23. Consumption of drugs, alcohol, tobacco etc. is prohibited in the campus. Action will be initiated against those who indulge in such practices.
24. Any case of criminal activity or violation of law and order in the college campus will be reported to the police.
25. Any student persistently insubordinate, repeatedly or wil-fully mischievous, guilty of fraud or malpractice in exams shall be removed from the rolls. The removal shall be either temporary or permanent depending on the gravity of the offence.
26. As per Government directions, mobile phone will not be permitted within the college campus for students. Students are therefore requested not to bring mobile phones to the college campus. Students and their bags will be searched randomly for mobile phones, in case of suspicion. The mobile phones thus collected from students will be confiscated. It can be recovered only by the parents of the students concerned on giving a fine of Rs.500 each and a written guarantee that this will not be repeated.

ATTENDANCE AND LEAVE OF ABSENCE

Attendance will be marked at the beginning of each hour by the teacher engaging the class. Attendance will not be granted to students who report after 9.30 am in the first hour.

If a student is absent for one hour it will be treated as absence for half a day, and if his absence is for two hours or more, it will be treated as absence for one full day. A student requiring leave for only a particular period may be granted such leave by the teacher concerned. Application for leave for more than one period must be submitted to the Principal in the prescribed form by 10.00 am. When absence is due to some unforeseen cause the application must be submitted as early as possible, and in no case, later than the first day of the student's return to the college.

Absence without prior request for leave from any examination or practical work will be reported by the teachers concerned to the Principal. Leave of absence from a term - examination should be obtained from the Principal. A student absenting himself for a period exceeding five working days whether with leave or without leave should, on his return to the college should report to the Principal. A student absenting himself without leave for more than ten consecutive days will have his/her name removed from the rolls, and he/she may be readmitted on payment of College dues, if any. Every application for leave shall be countersigned by the student's guardian and recommended by the staff guide or the Head of the Department.

The minimum attendance prescribed by the University is 75% of the working days in the semester. Exemption from shortage of attendance (subject to a maximum of 10 days) can be granted by the Syndicate on recommendation by the Principal, provided leave has been applied for and granted for such absence on satisfactory grounds. Such condonation will be granted for such absence on satisfactory grounds, but only twice during a programme. Duty leave for Physical Education activities will be granted only to athletes representing the college or universities in various matches, tournaments, and/or sports events. A student deputed to participate in matches, tournaments and sports events should submit his leave application duly recommended by the Director of Physical Education for necessary action, not later than one week after the event. The maximum period for which duty leave can be granted to a student for sports and athletics is limited to 10% of the total number of working days.

IDENTITY CARD

An Identity card along with a tag will be issued to the student at the time of admission. It is the responsibility of the student to see that the card is duly attested by the Principal. The student should wear this card while in the campus and produce the same on demand for inspection by any member on the staff. If a student is found not wearing

the identity tag, he/she shall be fined an amount of Rs. 50/-. If the card is lost, a duplicate can be obtained on payment of Rs.100/-. The Identity card will be required on many occasions such as, voting at the Students' Council Elections, claiming Hall Tickets, Mark Lists, Certificates, Scholarships, Stipends and the like.

THE LIBRARY

General Rules:

1. All the students and members of the staff are entitled to use the library for reference and borrowing books.
2. The Library is open from 8.30 am. to 4.30 pm. on all working days.
3. Students entering the library/reading room should be in possession of their identity cards, which will be checked at the lending and reference sections.
4. No personal articles, like books, umbrellas, folders etc. shall be taken by anyone in to the library/reading room. All such articles Shall be kept at the entrance at places assigned for the purpose before entering the library.
5. Strict silence should be observed in and around the library.
6. Each UG student will be issued threee borrower's tickets and PG students five tickets against each of which a book may be borrowed from the library. The Ticket is not transferable and fine of Rs.10/- will be charged for the loss of a borrower's ticket.
7. Books and periodicals must be carefully examined at the time of issue. The borrower shall be held responsible for any damage detected later.
8. Members are not allowed to sub lend the books of the library.
9. All marking, underlining etc. in any book, manuscript or map belonging to the library is absolutely forbidden. If a book is lost, or if it is damaged by a member, he/she shall pay the cost of the book. If any one volume of a set is spoiled or damaged the whole set is to be replaced.
10. It shall be the duty of the Librarian and his staff to examine the books returned by the borrowers and to take immediate action on all cases of mutilation or damage.
11. The loan period of books is a 14 days, but any book may be recalled at any time by the Librarian, even if the period of loan has not expired. When a book is returned after the due date, the borrower will pay a fine of Re 1. per book a day.
12. Books of the reference section and periodicals will not be lent out. However they may be consulted within the library after making necessary entries and signing in the Reference Register.
13. III DC and II PG students have to return library books and cards on the dates prescribed by the Principal.

14. Before applying for any certificate from the College, members have to get clearance/no dues certificate from the library.
15. Membership card may be suspended or Caution Deposit withheld if anybody acts against the rules and discipline of the library.

For Staff : Members of the staff are allowed to take upto 10 books at a time. Subject books may be returned at the end of the academic year and other books, within 15 days.

STAFF GUIDE

As envisaged by the U.G.C., a teacher will be appointed as staff guide for each class. He/She will meet the students individually or in groups. The staff guide will keep in touch with the student's progress in studies and other activities in general. Each class of students is bound to consult its staff guide before organizing any group activity and must abide by his directives always. It is through the staff guide that a student has to submit his/her leave application to the Principal. Any problem in the class, common or individual, shall be brought to the attention of the staff guide for necessary remedial measures.

MENTOR

A well structured 'Three Tier Mentoring System' is following in Deva Matha College Kuravilangad. At the base level, one faculty is allotted as mentor to a group of students (mentees). The endeavours of each student are guided by a mentor assigned by the college. The responsibilities of mentors often go beyond academic activities and encourage students on various aspects of his or her life. Each class is assigned a mentor who shall be available and accessible for one on one interaction with the students. The mentor will also, based on the assessment of the student, provide counseling and advice.

ADMISSION RULES

The admissions to UG and PG Programmes are governed by the rules and regulations prescribed by the Mahatma Gandhi University and the Government. Mahatma Gandhi University has introduced Single Window Admission Scheme under a Centralized Allotment Process (CAP). All students seeking admission to the college irrespective of the category/reservation, has to also register online through in CAP compulsorily.

A committee headed by the Principal and including Teaching and Non Teaching Faculty spearheads the college level admission process in tune with the instructions from the University. An admission help desk is available in the college office to assist the students in the procedure.

Admission under General Merit category, Cultural Quota, Sports Quota, Persons with Disabilities (PwD) Quota, Community Quota and SC/ST Reservation Category are through CAP only. Admissions under CAP will be based on the Allotment List provided by the University.

The candidates seeking admission through Management Quota will have to apply online through the Admission Portal in the college website within the dates prescribed by the University in the Admission Schedule. The college also provides option to complete the admission procedure in online mode.

FEE RULES

- a. Tuition fee for an year will be collected in one time at the beginning of each academic year from all students. (See Fee Chart)
- b. Fine for belated payment of tuition fees- within 7 working days from due date : Rs 5/- After 10 days Rs. 10/- If the fees and fines of an installment are not paid before the last opportunity given for payment of that installment the name of the student will be removed from the rolls of the College with effect from the date following the expiry of this period and if the student is re-admitted, he/she will get the benefit of attendance only from the date of re-admission. The last opportunity for payment of an installment of fees is defined as the last working day previous to the due date of the succeeding installment.
- c. The names of defaulters of an installment will be published on the notice board immediately after the expiry of the last opportunity fixed for payment of the installments.
- d. Students who are admitted for a term, so that they may make up shortage of attendance for the programme which they were undergoing, should pay one third of the tuition fee for the year together with full special fee and Caution Deposit at the time of admission. Only such of those former students of the respective colleges should be admitted as term students.
- e. In the case of casual students (undergoing one year's course) all fees including special fees and Caution Deposit due for the whole year will be collected at the time of admission.
- f. Every student is liable to pay the prescribed fee for the whole semester if his/her name is on the rolls of the college for any part of the year, provided that if a student studying in Arts and Science and Sanskrit Colleges for the Degree or Post Graduate programmes after obtaining transfer certificate from the institution is admitted to the same programme of study in any other similar colleges, he/she should not be called upon again to pay the fee already paid for the term in the colleges which issued T. C. But special fee and Caution Deposit will have to be paid again at the new college. He shall produce the fee receipt at the college where he joins afresh.
- g. In the case of students admitted later than the commencement of the academic year, the fee for the preceding months, if any, will be collected at the time of admission.
- h. If in a particular term, a student who stands admitted in a college but did not attend any of the classes, requests permission to discontinue his/her studies in that college and takes T.C. on that accord, the refund of fee may be ordered in his/her case. The claim for refund in such cases should be preferred by the student with the Principal by submitting an application within two months from the date of leaving the college as revealed from the entries in the transfer certificate issued to the applicant.

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- i. Students belonging to the Scheduled Castes, Scheduled Tribes, Other Backward Communities and OEC securing admission to the college will be eligible for the admission. These students will be given full fee concession on presentation of necessary community and income certificates from the Tahsildar concerned.
- j. All scheduled castes, scheduled tribes, OEC, OBC and KPCR students should submit printout of application from Akshaya Centre after the commencement of the classes in the college.
- k. Backward community students, who discontinue their studies before concessions being sanctioned, will be required to pay all fees before their transfer certificates are issued.
- l. Late Fee at the rate of Rs.50 (Rupees Fifty only) will be collected from the students who obtain T.C. after one year of the completion of their course.
- m. Students belonging to SC, ST, OEC, OBC(H) categories who are eligible for e-Grantz educational concession should pay the College fees within seven days once the amount credited to their Aadhaar linked bank account.

INSTRUCTIONS TO CANDIDATES APPEARING FOR EXAMINATIONS

1. The candidate should ascertain that the hall ticket has been issued under the seal and signature of the institution in which the candidate is pursuing study.
2. The candidate should also verify that the hall ticket pertains to the programme of study, and that the hall ticket bears the Permanent Register Number (PRN). Candidates should present their hall tickets to the invigilator for inspection on each day of the examination, including practical examinations and viva voce. Candidates without hall ticket will not be permitted into the examination halls.
3. The PRN is the unique identification number of a student. It contains 12 characters. Eg. 220012345678.
4. All candidates coming to attend the examination shall wear the ID tags issued from the college and be in the Uniform (other than on Wednesdays).
5. The candidate should write the name of the programme and his/her serial number in the answer book in the space provided for writing them. The number should also be written in words in the space provided. The space for writing the semester details in the answer book should be filled in exactly as printed on the hall ticket. Please refer to the sample sheet of the answer book displayed on the notice board of the college. Any doubts regarding this instruction should be invariably cleared with the college authorities before entering the examination hall.
6. The bar code printed on the answer book should not be tampered with. Stray marks on the bar code may result in improper decoding of your answer book after valuation.
7. The candidate should also write the course code, name of course and question paper code as it appears in the question paper on each day of examination on the answer book in the space provided.
8. Candidates should take their seats in the examination hall at least 15 minutes before the commencement of examination. Candidates presenting themselves more than thirty (30) minutes after the appointed time will not be admitted to the examination hall. Candidates who are undoubtedly suffering from infectious diseases of any kind will not be admitted.
9. Candidates should not write anything on their hall tickets or question papers other than that instructed (at 4 and 6) above. They are also prohibited from writing their name, PRN or anything else which would give any clue to their identity on any other part of the answer book. The answer books of candidates who violate this instruction will be invalidated.

10. Candidates will not be allowed to leave the examination hall during the first 30 minutes after the commencement of examination.
11. Candidate who does not behave properly towards the Chief / Assistant Superintendents / Invigilators of the Examinations or is found to have had recourse to malpractice of any kind is liable to be sent out of the examination hall forthwith and will also have his examinations invalidated.
12. Candidates are prohibited from bringing into the Examination Hall any type of electronic gadgets other than calculators permitted for certain specific examinations. Use of cell phone in the examination hall is strictly prohibited. Candidates are also warned against bringing any kind of printed matter from outside which would be considered malpractice in the examination hall. Such candidates are liable to be sent out of the examination hall forthwith.
13. The candidate should hand over the answer book to the invigilator on completion of the examination. Candidates are not allowed to leave the examination hall without handing over the answer book to the invigilator.
14. Violation of these instructions may involve cancellation of the examination and rustication for a period decided by the University.

RULES REGARDING REFUND OF CAUTION DEPOSIT

Claims for refund of Caution Deposit should be made immediately after the closing date of the college and before the opening date of the next academic year. Immediately after the expiry of the above period the name of the student who failed to claim the caution deposit will be published in the Kerala Government Gazette and if he/she is not claiming the refund of caution deposit within a period of two calendar months from the date of publication of the notification by the Principal in the Gazette, the whole amount due to the student will be permanently forfeited and the same will be remitted to the Government revenue.

N.B:- The student should keep in safe custody the receipt issued for remittance of Caution Deposit. The Caution Deposit amount will be refunded only if the Caution Deposit receipt is produced along with the application for refund of Caution Deposit.

PUBLICATIONS FROM THE COLLEGE

Newsletters and magazines provide a forum for students and faculty to express their views and insights on subject-related and general topics. **RAGGING IN THE CAMPUS IN ANY FORM IS STRICTLY
PROHIBITED AND IS PUNISHABLE BY LAW**

THE KERALA PROHIBITION OF RAGGING ACT, 1998

(ACT 10 OF 1998)

An act to prohibit ragging in educational institutions in the State of Kerala.

Preamble – Whereas it is expedient to prohibit ragging in educational institutions in the State of Kerala.

Be it enacted in the Forty-ninth Year of the Republic of India as follows-

- (1) Short title, extent and commencement –
 - (a) This Act may be called the Kerala Prohibition of Ragging Act, 1988.
 - (b) It extends to the whole of the state of Kerala.
 - (c) It shall to be deemed to have come in to force on the 23rd day of October, 1997
- (2) Definition – In this Act, unless the context otherwise required-
 - (a) Head of the educational institution means the Principal or the Headmaster or the person responsible for the management of that educational institution.
 - (b) Ragging means doing of any act, by disorderedly conduct, to a student of an educational institution, which causes or is likely to cause physical or psychological harm or raising apprehension or fear or shame or embarrassment to that student and includes.
 - (i) teasing, abusing or playing practical jokes on , or causing hurt to such student
or
 - (ii) asking a student to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course, willingly, do.
- (3) Prohibition of ragging- Ragging within or without any educational institution is prohibited.
- (4) Penalty for ragging- Whoever commits, participates in, abets or propagates ragging within, or without, any educational institution shall, on conviction, be punished with imprisonment for a term which may extend to two years and shall also be liable to a fine which may extend to ten thousand rupees.
- (5) Dismissal of student- Any student convicted of an offence under Section 4 shall be dismissed from the educational institution and such student shall not be admitted in any other educational institution for a period of three years from the date of order of such dismissal.

- (6) Suspension of student- (a) Whenever any student or, as the case may be, the parents or guardian, or a teacher of an educational institution complains, in writing, of ragging to the head of the educational institution, the head of that educational institution shall, without prejudice to the foregoing provisions, within seven days of the receipt of the complaint, enquire into the matter mentioned in the complaint and, if, prima facie, it is found true, suspend the student who is accused of the offence and shall, immediately forward the complaint to the police station having jurisdiction over the area in which the educational institution is situated, for further action.
- (b) Where, on enquiry by the head of the educational institution, it is proved that there is no substance prima facie in the complaint received under sub section (1), he shall intimate the fact, in writing, to the complainant.
- (7) Deemed abatement – If the head of the educational institution fails or neglects to take action in the manner specified in section 6 when a complaint of ragging is made, such person shall be deemed to have abetted the offence of ragging and shall, on conviction, be punished as provided for in Section 4
- (8) Power to make rules,- (i) The Government may, by notification in the Gazette, make rules for carrying out all or any of the purposes of this Act.
- (ii) Every rule made under this act shall be laid, as soon as may be after it is made, before the Legislative assembly, while it is in session for a total period of fourteen days which may be comprised in one session or in two successive sessions, and if before the expiry of the session in which it is so laid, or the session immediately following, the Legislative Assembly makes any modification in the rule or decides that the rule should not be made, the rule shall, thereafter, have affect only in such modified form or be of no effect, as the case may be so, however, that any such modification or annulment shall be without prejudice to the validity of anything previously done under that rule.
- (9) Repeal and Saving- (i) The Kerala prohibition of Ragging Ordinance, 1998 (2 of 1998), is hereby repealed.
- (ii) Notwithstanding such repeal, anything done or deemed to have been done or any action taken or deemed to have been taken under the said Ordinance shall be deemed to have been done or taken under this Act.

**SUMMARY OF UGC REGULATIONS ON CURBING THE MENACE OF
RAGGING IN HIGHER EDUCATIONAL
INSTITUTIONS, 2009**

1. PREAMBLE: In view of the directions of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 8.05.2009 and in consideration of the determination of the Central Government and the University Grants Commission to prohibit, prevent and eliminate the scourge of ragging.
2. OBJECTIVE: To eliminate ragging in all its forms from universities, deemed universities and other higher educational institutions in the country by prohibiting it under these Regulations, preventing its occurrence and punishing those who indulge in ragging as provided for in these Regulations and the appropriate law in force.
3. WHAT CONSTITUTES RAGGING: Ragging constitutes one or more of any of the following acts:
 - a) Any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student.
 - b) Indulging in rowdy or indisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension there of in any fresher or any other student.
 - c) Asking any student to do any act which such student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student.
 - d) Any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher.
 - e) Exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students.
 - f) Any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students.
 - g) Any act of physical abuse including all variants of it: sexual abuse, homosexual assaults, stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person.

- h) Any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student.
- i) Any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student.

4. MEASURES FOR PROHIBITION OF RAGGING: There are a number of such measures at institution level, University Level, District level etc. Some of them that are important for students to know are as follows:

- No institution shall permit or condone any reported incident of ragging in any form; and all institutions shall take all necessary and required measures, including but not limited to the provisions of these Regulations, to achieve the objective of eliminating ragging, within the institution or outside.
- All institutions shall take action in accordance with these Regulations against those found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, actively or passively, or being part of a conspiracy to promote ragging.
- Every public declaration of intent by any institution, in any electronic, audiovisual or print or any other media, for admission of students to any course of study shall expressly provide that ragging is totally prohibited in the institution, and anyone found guilty of ragging and/or abetting ragging, whether actively or passively, or being a part of a conspiracy to promote ragging, is liable to be punished in accordance with these Regulations as well as under the provisions of any penal law for the time being in force.
- The telephone numbers of the Anti-Ragging Helpline and all the important functionaries in the institution, including but not limited to the Head of the institution, faculty members, members of the Anti Ragging Committees and Anti-Ragging Squads, District and Sub Divisional authorities, Wardens of hostels, and other functionaries or authorities where relevant, shall be published in the brochure of admission/instruction booklet or the prospectus.
- The application for admission, enrolment or registration must be accompanied by an Anti Ragging affidavit signed by a student in a prescribed format and another Anti Ragging Affidavit signed by a Parent/Guardian. (Both these Affidavits can be downloaded from the Web)
- Any distress message received at the Anti-Ragging Helpline shall be simultaneously relayed to the Head of the Institution, the Warden of the Hostels,

the Nodal Officer of the affiliating University, if the incident reported has taken place in an institution affiliated to a University, the concerned District authorities and if so required, the District Magistrate, and the Superintendent of Police, and shall also be web enabled so as to be in the public domain simultaneously for the media and citizens to access it.

- On receipt of the recommendation of the Anti Ragging Squad or on receipt of any information concerning any reported incident of ragging, the Head of institution shall immediately determine if a case under the penal laws is made out and if so, either on his own or through a member of the Anti-Ragging Committee authorised by him in this behalf, proceed to file a First Information Report (FIR), within twenty four hours of receipt of such information or recommendation, with the police and local authorities, under the appropriate penal provisions.
 - The Commission shall maintain an appropriate data base to be created out of affidavits, affirmed by each student and his/her parents/guardians and stored electronically by the institution, either on its or through an agency to be designated by it; and such database shall also function as a record of ragging complaints received, and the status of the action taken thereon.
 - The Commission shall include a specific condition in the Utilization Certificate, in respect of any financial assistance or grants-in-aid to any institution under any of the general or special schemes of the Commission, that the institution has complied with the anti-ragging measures.
 - Any incident of ragging in an institution shall adversely affect its accreditation, ranking or grading by NAAC or by any other authorised accreditation agencies while assessing the institution for accreditation, ranking or grading purposes.
 - The Commission may accord priority in financial grants-in-aid to those institutions, otherwise eligible to receive grants under section 12B of the Act, which report a blemishless record in terms of there being no reported incident of ragging.
5. **ADMINISTRATIVE ACTION IN THE EVENT OF RAGGING:** The institution shall punish a student found guilty of ragging after following the procedure and in the manner prescribed here in under:
- The Anti-Ragging Committee of the institution shall take an appropriate decision, in regard to punishment or otherwise, depending on the facts of each incident of ragging and nature and gravity of the incident of ragging established in the recommendations of the Anti-Ragging Squad.
 - The Anti-Ragging Committee may, depending on the nature and gravity of the guilt established by the Anti-Ragging Squad, award, to those found guilty, one or more of the following punishments, namely;

- a) Suspension from attending classes and academic privileges.
 - b) Withholding/ withdrawing scholarship/ fellowship and other benefits.
 - c) Debarring from appearing in any test/ examination or other evaluation process.
 - d) Withholding results.
 - e) Debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc.
 - f) Suspension/ expulsion from the hostel.
 - g) Cancellation of admission.
 - h) Rustication from the institution for period ranging from one to four semesters.
 - i) Expulsion from the institution and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.
- Provided that where the persons committing or abetting the act of ragging are not identified, the institution shall resort to collective punishment
 - An appeal against the order of punishment by the Anti-Ragging Committee shall lie, (i) in case of an order of an institution, affiliated to or constituent part, of a University, to the Vice-Chancellor of the University; (ii) in case of an order of a University, to its Chancellor. (iii) in case of an institution of national importance created by an Act of Parliament, to the Chairman or Chancellor of the institution, as the case may be.
 - Where in the opinion of the appointing authority, a lapse is attributable to any member of the faculty or staff of the institution, in the matter of reporting or taking prompt action to prevent an incident of ragging or who display an apathetic or insensitive attitude towards complaints of ragging, or who fail to take timely steps, whether required under these Regulations or otherwise, to prevent an incident or incidents of ragging, then such authority shall initiate departmental disciplinary action, in accordance with the prescribed procedure of the institution, against such member of the faculty or staff. Provided that where such lapse is attributable to the Head of the institution, the authority designated to appoint such Head shall take such departmental disciplinary action; and such action shall be without prejudice to any action that may be taken under the penal laws for abetment of ragging for failure to take timely steps in the prevention of ragging or punishing any student found guilty of ragging.

**MAHATMA GANDHI UNIVERSITY
STUDENTS' CODE OF CONDUCT RULES – 2005**

Mahatma Gandhi University Students' Code of Conduct Rules-2005 introduced vide UO. No. 162/2004/2/Elen. dated 16 February 2005 has laid down rules for maintaining discipline in all colleges affiliated to the university, which will be binding on all students of the college. The university order prohibits political activity inside the campus. Political activity is defined as “any act, activity or conduct by any student in a college by which political ideologies of any political parties recognized by the Election Commission are preached, professed, imparted or disseminated by speeches, visible representation or other means of communication whatsoever”.

Prohibition on political activity inside the campus means the following:-

- (a) No student of a college shall get himself involved in any political activity by himself or abet the said activity to be carried on by fellow students inside the campus in any manner whatsoever and any such activity is hereby banned inside the campus.
- (b) Taking part in any political activity by organizing students or gathering inside the college campus for the purpose of doing any activity as defined in Rule 4 (6) shall constitute serious indiscipline. Every member of such a gathering shall be individually liable and responsible for the gross indiscipline in this regard and the Principal has the power to take disciplinary action against students who indulge in the aforesaid activities.
- (c) It shall constitute gross indiscipline to call for an appeal to strike based on policies and ideologies that may be preached by the political parties or their sister organizations or student wings. The participants in the strike as aforesaid shall be dealt with by the disciplinary authority and they will be punished as per the rules stated above.
- (d) No student of a college shall stage or indulge in any activity like dharna, gherao, obstructing entry to and from any class room, office, hall or other places inside the campus and such activities shall be treated as misconduct.
- (e) No student shall shout slogans inside the classrooms, office or any other place inside the campus and obstruct or cause disturbance to the everyday functioning of the institution.
