The Skill Hub operates in a well-equipped facility with Singer sewing machines, craft workspaces, and training rooms, providing students with a professional environment to develop their skills. The Hub regularly collaborates with the Women's Forum, IEDC, and Bhoomitrasena Club of the college to deliver a diverse portfolio of training programmes.

Key Objectives

- Enhance practical skills and livelihood capabilities among students
- Promote self-employment opportunities as a viable career pathway
- Foster creativity and innovation through hands-on vocational training
- Support economic independence and entrepreneurial mindset development

Training Areas

- Stitching & Tailoring — garment making, alterations, and fashion wear
- Jute Product Making — bags, mats, and decorative items
- Embroidery Work — hand embroidery and machine embroidery

Program Report

Deva Matha College, Kuravilangad, through its Skill Hub, in association with the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre, organized a Three Month Stitching Course from January to March 2023. The programme was designed as a practical training initiative to develop creative and tailoring skills among college students.

The course aimed to equip participants with essential knowledge and hands-on experience in garment construction and design. Under the guidance of Dr. Sr. Fancy Paul, the training sessions focused on building technical competence as well as nurturing creativity and precision in stitching.

Throughout the programme, students received systematic training in various tailoring services. The major areas covered included custom churidar stitching, designer blouse stitching, skirt and top tailoring, and frock stitching. Participants were introduced to measurement techniques, fabric selection, pattern drafting, cutting methods, and finishing processes. Emphasis was given to accuracy, neatness, and professional standards in garment production.

Practical sessions formed the core of the course. Students actively engaged in stitching different garments, applying the techniques they learned in class. Individual guidance was provided to help them refine their skills and overcome technical difficulties. The training environment encouraged innovation and attention to detail, enabling students to produce well-fitted and aesthetically appealing garments.

The programme also highlighted the scope of tailoring as a self-employment opportunity. Participants were encouraged to view stitching as a viable source of income and entrepreneurship. The course strengthened their confidence and enhanced their ability to undertake independent tailoring assignments.

Outcomes of the Programme

- Participants acquired practical skills in garment stitching and tailoring
- Students developed confidence in taking accurate measurements and drafting patterns

- Creative abilities in designing and customizing garments were enhanced
- Awareness of self-employment and entrepreneurial opportunities in tailoring increased
- The programme provided a strong foundation for professional growth in the field of fashion and garment construction

Program Report

Deva Matha College, Kuravilangad, in association with the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre, organized a three-month stitching training programme under the Skill Hub initiative from January to March 2024. The programme was designed to provide systematic training in stitching and tailoring, with the objective of enhancing creativity and developing practical sewing skills among participants.

The training programme focused on hands-on learning and skill enhancement in garment construction. Participants received practical instruction in custom churidar stitching, designer blouse stitching, skirt and top tailoring, and frock stitching. The sessions emphasized measurement techniques, fabric selection, pattern drafting, cutting methods, and finishing processes. Equal importance was given to neatness, precision, and aesthetic presentation.

Under the guidance and coordination of Dr. Sr. Fancy Paul, the programme maintained a structured schedule that allowed participants to gradually develop confidence and competence in stitching. The learning environment encouraged creativity and innovation, enabling students to design garments according to contemporary trends and individual preferences.

Practical exposure formed the foundation of the course. Participants actively engaged in stitching various garments from start to finish, thereby gaining real-time experience in tailoring. The programme also introduced students to the potential of self-employment and entrepreneurship in the field of fashion and tailoring services.

Outcomes of the Programme

- Participants acquired practical knowledge in garment measurement, cutting, and stitching
- Skills in custom churidar, designer blouse, skirt, top, and frock tailoring were developed
- Creativity and confidence in garment design were significantly enhanced



Program Report

A painting and drawing workshop was conducted from 1st to 4th August 2023 at Deva Matha College, Kuravilangad. The workshop aimed to provide participants with a creative platform to explore and enhance their artistic skills in both painting and drawing. The event was led by Ms. Sreeja P.K, a renowned artist, designer, and experienced art educator.

The workshop had a total of 15 participants, ranging from beginners to experienced artists, representing diverse ages and backgrounds, making it a vibrant and inclusive artistic gathering.

The workshop began with an introductory theoretical session on the fundamentals of painting and drawing, covering topics such as color theory, composition, and different drawing techniques. Participants were then guided through various drawing exercises including still life, figure drawing, and perspective drawing, using materials such as pencils, charcoal, and ink.

The painting segment allowed participants to experiment with watercolours, acrylics, and oils. Ms. Sreeja P.K conducted a live painting and drawing demonstration, offering valuable insights into the creative process. A group critique session at the end enabled participants to showcase their work and receive constructive feedback from the instructor and peers.

Program Report

Deva Matha College, Kuravilangad, in collaboration with the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre, conducted a Three Month Stitching Course during the period from January to March 2025 under the auspices of the Skill Hub. The programme was organized with the objective of enhancing practical tailoring skills and fostering creativity among students.

The course was structured to provide comprehensive training in garment construction through systematic and practice-oriented sessions. Under the leadership of Dr. Sr. Fancy Paul, participants were guided through the essential aspects of stitching, design, and finishing techniques. The training emphasized both technical accuracy and aesthetic appeal.

During the programme, students were trained in custom churidar stitching, designer blouse making, skirt and top tailoring, and frock stitching. Detailed instruction was provided on taking body measurements, drafting patterns, fabric cutting, assembling garments, and applying suitable finishing methods. Equal importance was given to precision, quality, and presentation in order to meet professional standards.

The sessions were highly interactive and practice-based. Each participant was given the opportunity to complete garments independently under supervision. Continuous feedback and individual mentoring enabled students to improve their craftsmanship and gain confidence in handling different types of fabrics and designs.

In addition to technical training, the programme created awareness about the potential of tailoring as a sustainable career option. Students were introduced to the possibilities of self-employment and small-scale entrepreneurship in the garment sector.

Outcomes of the Programme

Day One: Introduction to Jute

On the first day, participants were introduced to jute and its significance in promoting sustainability. The resource person explained its environmental benefits, emphasizing its biodegradable nature and its role in reducing dependence on synthetic materials. Students learned about the process of jute fiber extraction through practical exposure. An exhibition of different jute products — including bags, mats, and decorative pieces — was organized to demonstrate the versatility of jute. The session concluded with students learning basic crafting techniques and making simple items such as jute coasters.

Day Two: Project Work and Conclusion

The second day focused on practical application and creativity. Students were divided into groups and assigned to design and create jute products of their choice, applying the skills and techniques learned on Day One. The resource person shared personal experiences in working with jute and discussed its role in sustainable development and economic growth. Program Report

Deva Matha College, Kuravilangad, through its Skill Hub, organized a specialized art exhibition focused on jute products. The event aimed to promote eco-friendly craftsmanship and provide students with a platform to showcase their creative and entrepreneurial talents.

The exhibition was held from 23rd to 28th January 2026. During this period, the venue served as a vibrant marketplace and display centre, allowing visitors to engage with the student creators and understand the intricate process of working with natural fibres.

Programme Highlights

The initiative focused on the production and sale of diverse jute-based items. Students received training and guidance to manufacture high-quality goods, including:

- Handcrafted jute files and folders
- Trendy and durable jute bags
- Decorative home utilities and stationery items

A total of approximately 150 unique products were designed and manufactured by the students. This hands-on approach allowed participants to manage the entire lifecycle of a product — from the initial raw material stage to the final finishing touches.

Student Participation and Sales

A significant aspect of this exhibition was the direct involvement of students in the commercial process. All 150 products were marketed and sold out by the students themselves. This practical exposure provided them with invaluable lessons in:

- Product pricing and inventory management

Program Report

Deva Matha College (Autonomous), Kuravilangad, in association with the Innovation and Entrepreneurship Development Centre (IEDC), organized a comprehensive three-month practical training initiative titled 'Skill Hub.' This certificate course was specifically designed to provide college students with intensive hands-on experience in garment construction and tailoring, aiming to build both creative flair and long-term vocational skills.

The training sessions were scheduled from Monday to Friday, between 10:00 AM and 4:00 PM. Over the course of the three-month duration, the programme was coordinated under the professional guidance of Dr. Sr. Fancy Paul, ensuring a structured and supportive learning environment for all participants.

Core Objectives and Services

The primary focus of the Skill Hub was to equip students with essential techniques in fashion design and tailoring through a progressive curriculum. The course provided specialized training in several key areas:

- Custom Churidar Stitching — Students learned the fundamentals of drafting, cutting, and assembling traditional ethnic wear
- Designer Blouse Stitching — This module emphasized precision and decorative techniques required for high-end blouse designs
- Skirt and Top Tailoring — Participants explored the construction of Western and contemporary silhouettes
- Frock Stitching — Sessions included training on creating children's wear and layered garment designs

Methodology and Practical Exposure

The three-month timeframe allowed for a deep dive into a hands-on learning approach, moving beyond theoretical concepts to direct machine work and complex fabric handling. Participants were guided through the entire process of garment creation, from initial body measurements and pattern

making to advanced finishing touches. The extended duration allowed students to master different fabric types and styles, fostering an environment of innovation and professional self-expression.

Entrepreneurial Impact

Beyond technical proficiency, the Skill Hub highlighted the economic potential of tailoring. By mastering these skills over a sustained period, students were introduced to the possibilities of self-employment, boutique management, and freelance costume design. 
