

ALUMINI LECTURE -23rd MARCH 2025



SSB ORIENTATION PROGRAM

An SSB Orientation Programme was organized at Deva Matha College on 11/09/2025, with the objective of providing students with comprehensive guidance on the Services Selection Board (SSB) interview process. The session was led by Colonel M. P. Dinesh, an Ex-GTO with vast experience in training and assessment. The programme was coordinated by ANO Captain Dr. Sathees Thomas, with the assistance of ex-senior under officer Ms. Deepika Nair D.A total of 24 students from various colleges participated in the programme, which was conducted from 9:00 AM to 5:30 PM.

The schedule of the programme included the following key sessions:
Introduction to Personality Assessment in Armed Forces - Addressing myths and fallacies, with an interactive Q&A session.
Overview of the Three Techniques of Assessment - Covering Psychological Tests, Group Testing, and Personal Interview.
Introduction to Officer-Like Qualities (OLQs) and Tools & Techniques to Enhance OLQS -Providing a structured syllabus for SSB preparation.
PPDT (Picture Perception and Discussion Test) - Rationale, methodology, and a mock PPDT exercise.

Group Discussion (GD) Task - Explanation and insights.
Group Planning Exercise (GPE), Progressive Group Task (PGT), Group Obstacle Race (GOR), and Command Task - Detailed explanation of procedures and expectations.

Conference Procedure and Medicals - Guidance on the final assessment stage.

The programme also included mock practice sessions and opportunities for students to interact directly with the resource person. The discussions provided valuable insights into the qualities and preparation strategies required for success in the SSB interview.

The session was highly beneficial, giving participants greater clarity, direction, and motivation to pursue a career in the Armed Forces.

The SSB Orientation Programme proved to be a highly informative and effective initiative, equipping students with the necessary knowledge and skills to face the SSB selection process with confidence
