SCRAP TO CRAFT EXHIBITION (2022–23)

As part of World Environment Day celebrations, the P.G.Department of Commerce in association with SESREC and UBA organized an exhibition titled “Scrap to Craft – Conversion of Waste Materials into Useful Products” on 1st June 2022 at Deva Matha College. The exhibition aimed to promote environmental awareness and sustainable practices by encouraging students to convert waste and scrap materials into creative and useful products. A total of 63 participants displayed handmade crafts, demonstrating innovative recycling techniques and responsible waste management practices.

The exhibition served as a platform to showcase creativity while reinforcing the concept of waste-to-wealth. Students explained the making process of each craft, helping viewers understand practical recycling methods. The programme fostered environmental consciousness, inspired sustainable living practices, and strengthened the institution’s commitment to ecological responsibility.





HAND HYGIENE AWARENESS CAMPAIGN (2022–23)

The Hand Hygiene Awareness Campaign was organized by the P.G. Department of Commerce and Social Entrepreneurship under SESREC of Deva Matha College on 31st August 2022 at Kuravilangad town. The programme aimed to promote awareness about the importance of proper hand hygiene in preventing communicable diseases. Students, under the guidance of faculty coordinators, were divided into teams and actively engaged with the public. They demonstrated the correct hand washing technique as recommended by the World Health Organization, distributed pamphlets, displayed posters in shops, and interacted with vendors, employees, students, and pedestrians to spread awareness.

The campaign highlighted practical demonstration, direct community interaction, and inspection of hygiene practices in hotels and shops. Sweets were distributed to individuals who maintained proper hygiene as a gesture of appreciation. The programme effectively created awareness at the grassroots level, encouraged behavioural change in hygiene practices, and enhanced students' social responsibility and community engagement skills.



MALINYAMUKHTAM NAVA KERALAM PROGRAMME (2023–24)

In accordance with the Government of Kerala Higher Education Department order, Deva Matha College undertook a series of activities under the “Malinyamukhtam Nava Keralam” programme with the support of SESREC and Kuravilangad Grama Panchayath from May 22 to June 5, 2023. The initiative aimed at declaring the campus a ‘Zero Waste Campus’ through systematic planning and collective action. A preparatory meeting was convened by the Principal with representatives of NSS, NCC, PTA, SESREC, and the administrative wing. An internal waste audit was conducted, followed by household surveys and pamphlet distribution in the Panchayath area. A campus cleaning drive and waste segregation activities were organized, and the segregated waste was handed over to Panchayath authorities.

The programme concluded on World Environment Day with an interdepartmental quiz competition, sapling distribution, and inauguration of a fruit garden. The official declaration of the college as a ‘Zero Waste Campus’ marked the success of the initiative. Through the active involvement of SESREC, the programme strengthened environmental stewardship among students and the community while promoting sustainable waste management practices.



PLASTIC WASTE MANAGEMENT IN THE INSTITUTION (2023-24)

During the academic year 2023–24, the Plastic Waste Management initiative was launched on June 5, 2023 (World Environment Day) and continued throughout the year with the collaboration of SESREC, National Service Scheme (NSS), and National Cadet Corps (NCC). The programme benefited the general public and students of Deva Matha College and focused on reducing plastic consumption and promoting eco-friendly practices within the campus. Regular cleaning drives, awareness rallies, and educational activities were organized to encourage responsible plastic usage and environmental consciousness among students and staff.

The initiative emphasized reduction, reuse, segregation, and proper disposal of plastic waste as part of a sustained campus-wide effort. Students were encouraged to minimize single-use plastics by adopting reusable alternatives such as cloth bags and steel containers, while awareness programmes reinforced eco-friendly habits. Collected waste was systematically segregated into paper, plastic, and e-waste categories, and recyclable materials were periodically handed over to Haritha Karma Sena under Kuravilangad Grama Panchayath for proper recycling. Non-recyclable plastics were disposed of responsibly following environmental regulations, demonstrating the institution's continued commitment to sustainable waste management practices.





SURVEY ON AWARENESS, KNOWLEDGE, AND OPINION ON PLASTIC AND MICROPLASTIC POLLUTION (2023–24)

The survey on plastic and micro plastic pollution was organized by SESREC in association with the Department of Chemistry at Deva Matha College on June 5, 2023. Coordinated by Dr. Deepthi John, the initiative aimed to assess the level of awareness, knowledge, and opinions among staff and students regarding plastic usage and its environmental consequences. The survey also highlighted both the benefits and ecological challenges associated with plastic materials.

The findings indicated that 39% of respondents were unaware of micro plastic pollution, underscoring the need for enhanced awareness campaigns. Based on the outcomes, recommendations were made to reduce plastic consumption, promote recycling and reuse, and improve disposal systems. The initiative served as a foundation for future environmental education programmes facilitated by SESREC within the campus.

KERAM 2023 (KERALA PIRAVI CELEBRATION)

As part of Kerala Piravi celebrations on November 1, 2023, the Department of Botany of Deva Matha College organized 'KERAM 2023' with the encouragement of SESREC. The programme included cultural performances and participation in competitions, while the highlight was an exhibition showcasing value-added products derived from the coconut tree, commonly known as 'Kalpa Vriksha.' Most exhibits were handmade by students, reflecting creativity and traditional knowledge.

The exhibition received widespread appreciation from the college community. With the involvement of SESREC, the programme promoted sustainable utilization of natural resources and encouraged entrepreneurial thinking among students, while celebrating Kerala's cultural and ecological heritage.





CLEAN CAMPUS CHALLENGE (2023–24)

The Clean Campus Challenge was organized at Deva Matha College under the leadership of SESREC on November 15, 2023. The initiative involved a department-wise competition encouraging cleanliness, proper waste disposal, and teamwork. Departments actively participated in cleaning drives, and an attractive prize was awarded to the cleanest department.

Through the direction of SESREC, the programme fostered collective responsibility and strengthened eco-friendly practices across departments. It reinforced the principles of reduce, reuse, and recycle, contributing to a cleaner and greener campus environment.



CELEBRATION OF INTERNATIONAL YEAR OF MILLETS 2023 (2023–24)

The Department of Botany of Deva Matha College, supported by SESREC and Madhya Kerala Farmer Producer Company, organized the celebration of the International Year of Millets on December 20, 2023. A seminar titled “Millets: A Super Food” highlighted millet cultivation, processing, and nutritional benefits. An exhibition and sale of millet-based products further encouraged healthy dietary practices among students and staff.

Through this initiative facilitated by SESREC, the programme emphasized sustainable agriculture, food security, and health awareness. It successfully motivated participants to include nutritious millets in their daily diet while promoting environmentally responsible farming practices.




